What is Ohio's Coastweeks? It is part of an international celebration of our waters and shorelines held in the States and around the world. Ohio's program focuses on the theme, "I Can Help Lake Erie" to encourage people to be part of the solution, not the pollution that finds its way into the lake. The debris collected at all cleanups is recorded on data cards and submitted to the Ocean Conservancy. This data has been effective in yielding many state, federal and international laws relating to water quality and pollution prevention. 

Ohio Lake Erie Commission



The Ohio Lake Erie Commission, established by the Ohio General Assembly in 1990, was created to preserve Lake Erie's natural resources, protect the quality of its waters and ecosystem, and promote economic development within the region. The Commission is comprised of directors of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the departments of Natural Resources, Transportation, Development, Health and Agriculture. The Ohio Lake Erie Commission office, located in Toledo, serves as the Commission's administrative staff.

COMMISSION ACTIVITIES INCLUDE:

LAKE ERIE BALANCED GROWTH PROGRAM

Balanced growth is a strategy to protect and restore Lake Erie and its watersheds to assure long-term economic competitiveness, ecological health, and quality of life. The Commission is committed to assisting watershed-based planning efforts to help define areas most appropriate for development and conservation. To help Ohio achieve these goals, we support solutions that are unique to Ohio and respect our traditions - the Balanced Growth Program does just that.

LAKE ERIE PROTECTION FUND

The quality of Lake Erie and its shoreline has improved over the past 30 years, and Ohio's Lake Erie Protection Fund has played an important role. The Fund provides monies to organizations to accelerate progress toward protection and restoration of Lake Erie. Monies for this Fund are generated when citizens purchase an *Erie...Our Great Lake* license plate. Together we are improving Lake Erie while making Ohio a destination of choice.
